Climate Change Mitigation Strategies for Land and Water Resources

"Though New York State is well endowed with water resources, expected changes in the earth's climate could significantly impact the amount, intensity and timing of future precipitation. In addition, sea level rise and the possibility of increased coastal storm intensity will increase the likelihood of coastal flooding. Current management of land and water resources is generally based on the climate record of the past 50 years. Looking ahead, we need to consider land and water resource management strategies, including infrastructure design and deployment, which will be effective under a range of possible future climates. Such strategies could include employing no-regret options, taking advantage of low-cost margins of safety, and building flexible and adaptable institutional and policy frameworks. In the long run, adapting to climate change will require engagement of and coordination between all levels of government, as well as the public and private sectors." Susan J.
