

INTRODUCTION

Greetings:

When Cornell opened its doors to the first class in 1868, five international* students enrolled. Every year since then, international students have studied on the Ithaca campus. Remarkably, almost without exception, the enrollment has been on a growth curve since World War II.

In 1996-97, 2546 international students representing 126 countries constitute 13.19% of the total enrollment. This year we note a slight dip in enrollment as the number of international students dropped from 2609 in 1995-96 to 2546. The recent shift of the LLM (Masters in Law) program from the Graduate School to the Law School makes it somewhat difficult to pinpoint accurately the cause of the decline. Clearly, however, the drop is at the post-graduate level. Undergraduate enrollment has swelled from 393 in 1986 to 807 this past fall term 1996.

A new table, located in the section entitled Ivy League and Other Institutions, shows that Cornell has the highest percentage of international students enrolled at the graduate level, while MIT has the highest overall percentage of international students.

Sadly, the steady decline in the number of African students has continued since a recent high of 134 in 1991. This year we have only 90 students from Africa.

Nationally, Cornell ranked 12th in total international student enrollment for the academic year 1995-96 (the latest year for which national figures are available) and 16th in terms of percentage of all students for institutions enrolling 1000 or more international students.

While the international student enrollment declined slightly as noted above, the number of international scholars (foreign academic staff) increased unabatedly over the last 10 years from 816 in 1986-87 to 1205 in 1995-96. In 1995-96, Cornell hosted the 8th largest number of foreign scholars nationwide (not counting the Medical School campus in New York City).









INTERNATIONAL GRADUATE ENROLLMENT 1986-1997




INTERNATIONAL PROFESSIONAL ENROLLMENT 1986-1997





AS A PERCENT OF TOTAL INTERNATIONAL ENROLLMENT






INTENSIVE ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROGRAM ENROLLMENT 1987-1997








INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ENROLLMENT AT IVY LEAGUE AND OTHER INSTITUTIONS 1995-97




INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS AS A PERCENT OF ALL STUDENTS 1995-1997




INTERNATIONAL GRADUATE STUDENTS AS A PERCENT OF ALL STUDENTS 1996-1997






**1996-97 INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ENROLLMENT
AT IVY LEAGUE AND OTHER INSTITUTIONS**




**1995-97 INTERNATIONAL GRADUATE
