Introduction

These charts and tables, compiled by the International Students and Scholars Office, reflect the continuing growth in the number of students and scholars from abroad who study, teach and perform research at Cornell University.

The following highlights may be of interest:

- 74% increase in international student enrollment from 1982 until 1992
- Doubling of the entering class of freshman/transfers since 1987
- 75% of international students are enrolled in graduate or professional programs
- Nearly one-third of international student enrollment is female
- Over 50% of international students are from Asia
- 116 countries/geographic areas are represented in the international student body
- Over 200 students are enrolled from each of the following: People's Republic of China, Canada, Taiwan and Japan
- Over 300 students from 25 countries studied full time intensive
- A record number of over 1000 faculty and researchers from 69 countries were appointed to 116 academic units in 1991-92

Please note the following as you read the charts:

- Only students fully enrolled during fall term 1992 have been counted.
- Data for international scholars (foreign academic staff) holding teaching and research positions is compiled at the end of the fiscal year (June 30) in order to capture an accurate count. Only international visitors who received an academic appointment are counted.
- •Data from Open Doors (published by IIE), which is based on fall term 1991, but published in 1992, is the most recent national data available. This means that on occasion tables or charts representing different years may appear on the same page, so please read titles and captions carefully.

Special thanks to Jobi Petty, Program Coordinator, and Mary Arsenault, Administrative Aide, in the International Students and Scholars Office for their design and preparation of this report, and to Elissa Olevano, Office Manager, for her long-term commitment to maintaining accurate data.



International Students at Cornell University for the academic year 1992-93



International Student Enrollment (1982 to 1992)




International Students as Percentage of Total Enrollment (1982 to 1992)







Cornell National Ranking International Student Enrollment 1991-92

International Students as Percentage of Total Enrollment 1992-93




International Freshmen and Transfer Students Entering Cornell




Percentage of International Students in Undergraduate Divisions




Graduate & Professional vs. Undergraduate International Students

Male vs. Female International Students










Total Enrollment




1991-93 International Student Enrollment at Ivy League Institutions and Friends








1991-93 International Student Enrollment at Ivy League Institutions and Friends
