Introduction

Since 1936, the International Students and Scholars Office, or its predecessors, have charted international student enrollment at Cornell. We are pleased to share this year's statistical report that demonstrates the enrollment and employment of foreign students and visiting foreign academic staff. Note the report is divided into three sections, International Students, Foreign Academic Staff, and Ivy League Institutions and Friends. Below are a few highlights of this year's report.

Nationwide trends:

- In 1993-94, the top five providers of students to the US were China, Japan, Taiwan, India, and Korea; while that same year at Cornell our top five countries were Canada, Taiwan, China, Japan, and India. This year (1994-95) our top five countries of enrollment are Canada, Taiwan, India, Japan, and China. This minor reshuffling of the top Asian countries is not significant and matches the decline in the total number of students in the US from China. This decline may still be related to the large number of Chinese students who shifted to US permanent residence based on a special federal law related to the Tiananmen Incident in 1989. See page 17 for comparison between Cornell and the rest of the U.S.
- The proportion of overall enrollment of Asian students in the US has increased dramatically over the last 15 years and continues an unbroken increase since the Open Doors publication began in 1954. For the previous 5 years, the Asian student enrollment increased on average by 7%, this year it nearly leveled off with a 1.5% increase. European student enrollment increased 7.6%, from 1992-93 to 1993-94, while Middle Eastern students declined by 2.4%, continuing a 10 year drop off. African student enrollment finally increased nationwide a modest .2%, reversing a 10 year decline. This is due to an increase in East African enrollment.

Campus trends:

- After continuous international student growth this past decade in total numbers and in proportion of enrollment, our total enrollment leveled off at 2,567, an increase of three students. The effect of the federal "Green Card" program for certain citizens of the People's Republic of China is likely still being felt. The proportion of total Cornell enrollment dropped slightly to 13.3%.
- Freshman and transfer enrollment for fall term 1994 fell to 193.
- Nearly every undergraduate college increased their proportion of international students with the School of Hotel Administration leading at 13.3%.
- Not quite one-third of all international students are new and over one-third of all international students are women.
- A record 1056 foreign academic staff from 76 countries were appointed during fiscal year 1994 continuing more than a decade of growth.

Please remember the following:

- Only students fully enrolled for fall semester 1994 have been counted.
- Foreign academic staff appointed at any time during FY 1994 are included.
- Additional data on national trends is courtesy of Open Doors, 1993-94, Institute of International Education, NY.

Special thanks to Gang Wang, International Student Adviser for the design and preparation of this report; to Donna Bamforth for her diligence in counting the foreign academic staff; and finally, to Elissa Olevano, Office Manager, for her long-term commitment to maintaining an accurate accounting of international students. 




International Student Enrollment at Cornell (1984 to 1994)



International Students as Percentage of Total Cornell Enrollment (1984 to 1994)





Cornell National Ranking International Student Enrollment 1993-94



International Students as Percentage of Total Cornell Enrollment 1994-95








Percentage of International Students in Undergraduate Divisions




International Undergraduate Enrollment by College (Percentage)




Graduate & Professional vs.

Male vs. Female International Students







Regional Trend










Total Enrollment






1993-95 International Student Enrollment at Ivy League Institutions and Friends








1993-95 International Student Enrollment at Ivy League Institutions and Friends
