

Note: \* George Martin b. Dec. 26, 1767, Kanojahara, New York; d. Feb. 8, 1853 Grand River, Canada West. Built a house on a high bluff over looking the Grand River, two miles south-east of Cainsville. Area became the Martin Settlement. According to his granddaughter W.K. Loft, Chief George Martin accompanied Capt. Joseph Brant when he selected the Grand River lands for Six Nations. He was a close friend of William Claus and served as an interpreter for the Indian Affairs.

<sup>\*\*</sup> Catherine Rolleston had been taken captive by the Mohawks in her youth near Philadelphia. She was adopted by the family of Teyonhahwea (Double Life), who was one Confederacy Chief. She learned the Mohawk customs and language. Died Jan. 28, 1837. (Source: Files, Angela, Brant County Museum, Brantford, ON)
