WOMEN'S RESIDENTIAL HALLS

SUMMER SESSION

CORNELL University has three Residential Halls for Women in which rooms and board may be obtained during the Summer Session by registered students only. Besides these halls, there are certain University Houses which are occupied exclusively by women. The halls and houses are all under the direct supervision of the Dean of Women. They are:

Sage College, which accommodates 175 students: Here the charge for room, table board, and a specified amount of laundry, for the session of six weeks, is from \$75 to \$90, according to the size and location of the room. This building is situated on the campus, in attractive surroundings and within easy reach of all the other University buildings. An electric elevator runs to the upper floors. The common rooms include a drawing room and six reception rooms, a students' reading room, and dining rooms. The gymnasium and swimming tank for the student women of the University are in this building. The students living in the building are under the immediate charge of the Warden of Sage College.

The house at **No. 1 East Avenue** accommodates twenty-three students. The residents take their meals in the Sage College dining room and are subject to the rules and regulations that govern the residents of Sage College. The house contains four bathrooms—one on the first floor, two on the second, and one on the third. There are two reception rooms on the first floor.

The house at **No. 3 East Avenue** accommodates twenty-one students. The residents take their meals in the Sage College dining room and are subject to the rules and regulations that govern the residents of Sage College. There is a bathroom on every floor. The students living in the house have the use of a large reception room on the first floor.

The house at **No. 5 East Avenue** accommodates eighteen students. The residents take their meals in the Sage College dining room and are subject to the rules and regulations that govern the residents of Sage College. The house contains four bathrooms—one on the first floor, two on the second, and one on the third. There are two reception rooms on the first floor.

The house at **No. 7 South Avenue** accommodates twenty-eight students. It is situated on the campus about three minutes walk from Sage College. The residents take their meals in the Sage College dining room and are subject to the rules and regulations that govern the residents of Sage College. There is a bathroom on every floor. On the first floor are two reception rooms.

The house at **No. 15 East Avenue**, directly across the street from Sage College, accommodates twenty-one students. The residents take their meals in the Sage College dining room and are subject to the rules and regulations that govern the residents of Sage College. The house contains four bathrooms—one on the first floor, two on the second, and one on the third. There are two reception rooms on the first floor.

Cascadilla Hall. In this building, which accommodates about 105 students, a furnished room can be obtained for the session at a cost of \$23 to \$29. The charge includes a specified amount of laundry. The University conducts a cafeteria in this building where meals can be obtained at reasonable prices; residents of the building are free to get their meals where they choose. The building is reserved for women during the Summer Session but during the rest of the year it is occupied by men. It has shower baths and not tubs, but the use of a rubber bathing cap usually overcomes any objection to the shower. Students living in this building are under the charge of the Warden of Cascadilla Hall.

Prudence Risley Hall, which accommodates 184 students. Here the charge for room, table board, and a specified amount of laundry, for the session, is from \$81 to \$90, according to the size and location of the room. It is a fireproof building, beautifully situated on the north bank of Fall Creek Gorge, within easy reach of the main University buildings. Almost every one of the rooms is designed for a single occupant, and the building was so planned that every room in which a student lives receives sunlight at some time in the day. An electric elevator runs to the upper floors. On the first floor are three large drawing rooms, a large recreation room, and dining rooms. The students living in the building are under the immediate charge of the Warden of Prudence Risley Hall.

Risley Cottage, situated within the grounds of Risley Hall, accommodates eleven students. The residents take their meals in the Risley dining room and are subject to the rules and regulations that govern the residents of Risley Hall. There is a bathroom on each floor and a reception room on the first floor.

The house at No. 308 Wait Avenue, within two minutes' walk of Risley Hall, accommodates twenty students. The residents take their meals in the Risley dining room and are subject to the rules and regulations that govern the residents of Risley Hall. There is a bathroom on each floor. Students living in the house have the use of two reception rooms on the first floor.

Besides the halls and houses named above, there are certain approved houses which are occupied exclusively by women and which are also under the direct supervision of the Dean of Women. The list of approved houses will be available after June 1st on application to the Manager of Residential Halls, and also, if desired, a supplementary list of private houses with desirable rooms available for mature women who prefer to live outside any of the halls or university houses. Undergraduate women students of Cornell and other colleges and other women students under twenty-one years of age are expected to live in the residential halls or the university houses. Every woman student should consult the Dean of Women before engaging a room. Members of the Summer Session who lodge outside Sage College and Prudence Risley Hall may obtain table board at either of those halls for \$9 a week. Students living in either Sage College or Risley Hall are required to take their meals in the dining room of that hall. Both those dining rooms are conducted by the University.

Each of the residential halls is in charge of a warden, who is glad to know the students, to advise them in illness or other emergency, and to give them whatever information they wish about the University or the town. It is understood that persons living in the halls or the houses will conform to the house regulations made for the convenience and comfort of all. As the persons living in these buildings during the session are attending the University for serious work, it is necessary that the rooms and corridors should be kept quiet during the hours of study and rest. Persons unwilling to conform to reasonable regulations for ensuring quiet are not wanted in the buildings.

FURNISHINGS

All the buildings have electric lighting. Every room is completely furnished. Each student furnishes her own towels and soap and makes her own bed. All other services and supplies are included in the charge for residence. Students are not permitted to keep their trunks in their rooms. The telephone service in the residential halls

is on the pay-station plan; no charge is made for incoming calls, but outgoing messages are charged for.

APPLICATIONS

Applications for rooms in any of the residential halls or university houses should be made to the Manager of Residential Halls, Morrill Hall, Cornell University. A deposit of five dollars must accompany the application; otherwise the application will not be entertained. Checks should be drawn to the order of Cornell University.

If a room assigned is occupied by the applicant, the amount of the deposit is held until the end of the session to ensure the completion of the lease and the return of keys and to cover any damage to building or furniture other than ordinary wear and tear. The deposit will be refunded if the applicant gives formal notice to the Manager on or before June 15 that she wishes to withdraw her application. It is required that this deposit be withdrawn by September 1st after the end of the Summer Session.

ASSIGNMENT

Rooms are assigned strictly in the order of application. A double room may not be held by one student even though she be willing to pay the full price.

The University reserves the right to reassign any room that is not occupied by registration day unless notice has been received before that date of delay in arrival. It is required that each student shall register immediately upon her arrival in the hall in which she has engaged her room. The University reserves all rights in connection with the assignment or reassignment of rooms or the termination of their occupancy.

PAYMENT

Rooms are rented only for the Summer Session as a whole, and the entire payment for room, board, and laundry (in Cascadilla Hall for room and laundry) must be made at the beginning of the term in advance.

Students who wish to wait on table in order to earn their board should apply to the Manager of Residential Halls in advance.

LAUNDRY

Every piece sent to the laundry should have the owner's name plainly marked on it with Payson's indelible ink or with an embroidered name tab. Marking with a rubber stamp or with the so-called indelible pad is not effective.

The laundry allowance is fifteen pieces every week, according to the following scale:

1 towel counted as 1 piece
4 handkerchiefs
4 napkins
1 pair stockings1
1 dress4
1 shirtwaist
1 middy blouse
1 petticoat
1 plain skirt
1 plain princess slip
1 nightdress1
1 union suit
2 vests
1 brassiere
1 step-in
1 muslin combination

The weekly allowance includes only two shirtwaists, or two plain skirts, or one shirtwaist and one plain skirt or other starched or fancy piece, and the substitution of more pieces of that kind for plain articles is not permitted. An extra charge is made for wash dresses, fancy petticoats, and fancy shirtwaists. Outside laundrymen or washerwomen are not allowed to call at the dormitories.

Shades, lamps, or crockery broken or missing and all damage to rooms, fixtures, or furniture, other than ordinary wear and tear, will be charged to the occupants of the rooms. No articles are to be tacked or fastened in any way to the walls, furniture, or electric light fixtures.






